During lunch please paint your hand print, along with your child's, on our Craft room door, as our Kids Matter launch to promote positive community/school partnerships.

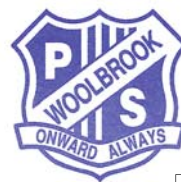
